Manager's Office

1. Interviews were conducted for the position of Multimedia Specialist.
2. Mr. Whitmore and the Mayor attended the North Central West Virginia Business Summit held in Fairmont last week.
3. There will be a Road Naming Ceremony for John Raymond 'Sheriff' Tiano this Friday at 1:00p.m. on N. 20th Street between Gould Ave and Pride Ave.

Police Department

1. The Department responded to 2,262 calls for service for the month of October leading to 20 felony and 110 misdemeanor arrests. Thirty-eight motor vehicle accidents were investigated.
2. Six new police officers will be sworn in on Tuesday, November 9th at 10:00 in Council Chambers.
3. The Department received a \$2,500 community grant from the Clarksburg Walmart to update computers in the patrol room.
4. The Department is participating in No Shave November to raise money for the Children's Hospital in Morgantown.

Fire Department

1. The Department responded to 298 calls for service for the month of October.
2. The Fire Marshal performed 19 inspections and provided Fire Safety Lessons for Fire Prevention Month to over 250 children in our local schools.
3. The truck committee performed their final inspection of the ladder truck, and it will be delivered the week of December 13th.

City Parks

1. The Department has received over 100 signatures endorsing the pickleball renovation project as we seek grant funding for the project.
2. The Truck or Treat had over 2,000 children attend, and 31 local businesses and organizations participated.
3. A local monument company has been contracted to repairing the City's monument at Monticello Park.
4. The Local Rotary Clubs held a mini golf fundraiser at the River Bend Mini Golf and raised over \$3,000 for polio vaccinations.

Robinson Grand Performing Arts Center

1. Beatlemania Magic will be performing this Saturday, November 6th at 8:00pm.
2. STOMP will perform on November 13th and 14th. The Cultural Foundation of Harrison County and the Barbara B. Highland Fund for the Arts have sponsored these events.

Code Enforcement

1. The Department issued 39 building permits for a total project cost of \$146,286. Twenty-four notices of violations were issued, six structures were condemned, and 23 were moved to demolition.
2. Twenty-six residential and 7 commercial inspections were performed. Seventeen vehicles were tagged for towing.
3. Animal Control responded to 42 calls for service with 11 animals taken to HCAC.

Public Works

1. Fall cleanup is now completed with 104 loads or 180.72 tons of garbage collected.
2. The Annual Fall Leaf Cleanup has begun.
3. Preparations are beginning for Winter Operations.
4. The Sewer Department replaced 315 feet of sanitary and stormwater lines.

Wastewater Treatment Plant

1. The Plant treated 199 million gallons of wastewater for the month of October with no violations to report.
2. The Plant received 182,955 gallons of septage for a revenue of \$9,941.
