

CITY MANAGERS REPORT/UPDATE

Council meeting

June 02,2022

CITY PARKS DEPARTMENT:

1. Splash Zone opened on May 29th with approx. 400 people, Memorial Day's crowd exceeded 1,000 people.
2. At the Amphitheater on June 24th there will be a movie in the park (Encanto) and the Wheeling Symphony with fireworks will be there on July 2nd.
3. The pickleball and ice-skating rink are proceeding and negotiations for services are continuing.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

1. The fire department responded to 298 calls for service, with 170 calls being medical in nature in the month of May.
2. Firefighters attended a pumper maintenance class and a three-day vehicle extrication class conducted by interstate rescue.

Police Department:

1. The Police Department responded to 2196 calls for service in the month of May.
2. The Department took part in the Fallen Officer Memorial service at FBI CJIS Division where Charleston Police officer Cassey Johnson was remembered, and her name added to the memorial.
3. The Department tested twice in May for probationary officers.
4. With the help of Ring Camera program, 10 thefts from residents' porches were cleared and subjects were charged.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

1. 47 permits were issued in May, total job cost of \$5,374,817.00 with permit cost of \$48,508.00.
2. 73 notices of violations were issued, 39 building inspections were completed.
3. Department issued 167 notices of violation for high grass in May, 70 property owners complied by maintaining their property, Public Works cut 44 of the properties in May

The Office of the City Manager would like to remind residential and commercial property owners it is their responsibility to cut and maintain their property, the sidewalk and curb line area adjoined to their property.

ROBINSON GRAND:

1. The Robinson Grand is highly booked in the month of June with only 10 open dates in the entire month. Currently bookings for four local dance recitals and shows, a 50th Wedding Anniversary, training classes and on June 29th the summer movie (Paw Patrol) will be played.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

1. Tommy Thomas street dedication will be held on June 3rd at 1:00 PM in the Glenwood Hill Section of Clarksburg.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT:

1. Finance received 152 business license renewals and 31 new business license applications.
2. Received \$665,708.25 in B&O tax payments and collected \$24,375.28 in Fire Service Fees.
3. Finance Department would like to remind business owners license will expire June 30, 2022, license renewals for the year 2022-2023 have been mailed, if you have not received one, please contact the finance department at 304-624-1630.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT:

1. The plant treated 295 million gallons of wastewater with no violations.
2. Several Tank inspections have begun during the month of May.
