

## **CITY MANAGERS REPORT/UPDATE**

**Council meeting**

**August 18, 2022**

**From the City of Clarksburg, Harrison County Schools will be starting classes next week, and we encourage all vehicle travelers to use extra precaution when driving to keep all school children safe.**

### **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

1. Fire Department responded to 293 calls for service in July.
2. Responded to 3 structure fires with a total loss of \$20,000.00.
3. Lt. Jason Stalnaker completed a two-week course at the National Fire Academy on Fire Investigations.

### **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

1. Police Dept. responded to 1990 calls for service in month of July.
2. National Night Out event was a huge success, dept. would like to thank all the volunteers and businesses for their assistance.
3. Dept. would like citizens to keep an eye out on their purses while shopping and never leave them unattended in the shopping carts.

### **CODE ENFORCEMENT:**

1. 103 building permits were issued in the month of July for a total job cost of \$747,995.51.
2. 54 notices of violation were issued, and 28 inspections were performed.
3. New demo list is being started for the fiscal year.

### **PUBLIC WORKS:**

1. Public Works is in the process of building and re-installing the barricades for the sidewalk of the Waldo building.
2. They have completed curb and cross walk painting in the local school areas, and they are continuing curb painting in neighborhoods.

**ROBINSON GRAND:**

1. Two shows are scheduled, on 8/20/22- Italian Bred and 8/26/22- Good Shot Judy Concert.

**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:**

1. Like to remind everyone, WV Italian Heritage Festival on 9/2 – 9/4 and the Black Heritage Festival on 9/09 - 9/11, will be held in downtown, and both festivals will be held at full capacity.
2. Next Comprehensive Plan meeting will be held 9/14/22 at city hall, also information will be posted in front of city hall on Fridays of both festivals.

**WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT:**

1. The Discharge Monitoring Report was submitted for July with no violations.
2. Applications are being accepted for Wastewater Operator until August 19<sup>th</sup>.
3. The smokestack for the old incinerator is currently being torn down by Michel Inc.
